Tram line 2, 4 to «Hoeschgasse», then bus line 33 to bus stop «Botanischer Garten».

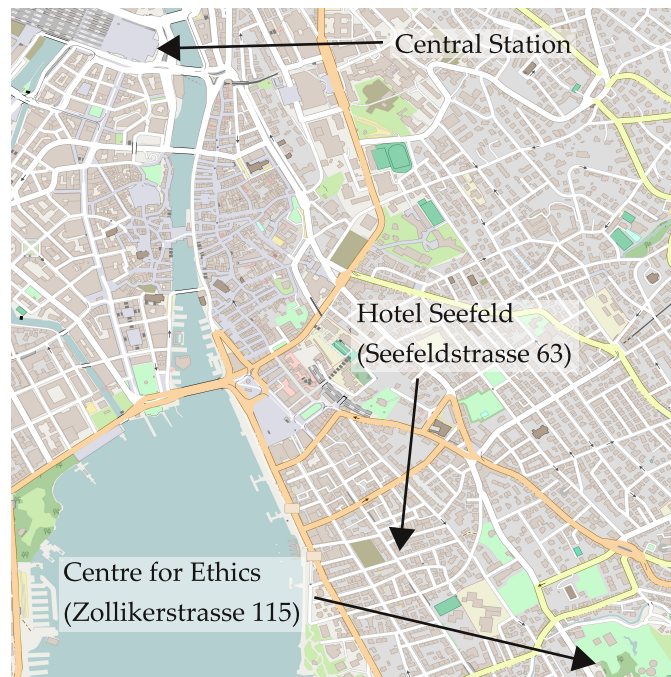
From Zurich Airport to the Hotel:

Goods and the Good

Value theory has recently received renewed attention in moral philosophy, in both metaethics and normative ethics. Classical topics such as the good life, which had in the recent past been neglected in favor of interpersonal morality, are again being widely discussed. There are also several attempts to give “the good” a more prominent role in theories about what we owe to each other. Building on these debates, the workshop will address two subjects. The first subject concerns the nature of the good, while the second subject is devoted to what things are good, and to their normative significance.

Our workshop will provide an excellent forum to discuss these issues. For each topic, two distinguished philosophers will present papers, made available to all participants one month prior to the workshop. During the sessions, the authors will give a presentation of about 30 minutes, followed by a plenary discussion. By restricting the number of attendees to no more than 35, the organizers aim to ensure an informal atmosphere in order to stimulate an open and fruitful exchange. Adding to this atmosphere, the workshop will take place in Zurich, one of Switzerland’s most beautiful and culturally rich cities.
